

POLICY FOR PHOTOGRAPHY & FILMING OF YOUTH EVENTS

1. PUBLICATION OF EVENT PHOTOGRAPHY & FILM

Photographs and video recordings of IMMAF events are published in the media and on the websites, social media and other platforms of IMMAF and affiliated organisations.

2. ACCREDITATION OF PHOTOGRAPHERS/ VIDEOGRAPHERS

Photographers at IMMAF events wishing to publish photos in the media or in any other form (e.g. internet websites), or wishing to use them for anything other than personal use must be officially registered and accredited by the IMMAF

3. RESTRICTED AREAS

Use of press or public cameras is restricted in private zones of the venue, such as the athlete changing and warm-up areas. These will be marked clearly at the point of entry as "No Camera Zone". The restriction also applies to mobile phone cameras, and mobile phone use may also be restricted in certain zones at IMMAF's sole discretion.

4. PHOTOGRAPHY & FILMING BY THE PUBLIC

Photographs and videos can be taken by the public from public areas for personal use only. They may not be published in any form (including personal or club websites) without written permission from IMMAF or a participating National Federation.

Where permission has been granted by a National Federation, permission is solely granted for the photography or filming of the National Federation's team. Competitors from other teams may only appear in group shots taken with members of the National Team or with other teams, or in matches against National Team competitors.

5. RESPECTING THE WISHES OF PARTICIPANTS

Photographers and videographers must first and foremost respect the wishes of participants and their legal guardians. It is requested that photographers and videographers ask before taking photos outside of the Competition Area.

It is not possible for IMMAF to prevent photographs of any particular individual from appearing in the media. If this is a problem for a participant or a legal guardian, they are advised not to take part in the event: An Image Rights Waiver Form will have been signed as prerequisite of participating in the Championships. If any participant or legal guardian wishes a particular picture of their child appearing on IMMAF platforms to be removed they can request this by contacting IMMAF.

IMMAF will always act to prevent any harassment and intrusion. Any course of behaviour that could be construed as harassment is potentially a criminal matter.
