a) WADA - signatory application

Application completed. This was a team effort where several members assisted for completion with a wide range of over 100 issues addressed. We will need to step up with items such as a registered testing pool e.g. the top 32 athletes across 16 weight divisions will require random 'out of competition testing', 3 times a year. This brings additional significant financial cost to IMMAF in addition to the annual \$10K payable to WADA.

Currently looking at how we can mimimize our financial exposure on the testing side. Michelle is working with WADA in pursuit of them accepting blood spot test which is a much cheaper option to that of urine test which is also less time for results. Also discussed out of competition testing prior to or during competitions.

WADA case remains on hold. Lawyers have followed up and will notify the court regarding extending the hold period. A letter was drafted to the court and now the case is set aside until October 2021. Once the WADA application process is complete, there may not be any need for the court case. DW commented we had good feedback on the application so far..

c) EVENTS

Events have now commenced e.g. The Youth World Championships was switched from Turkey to Sofia at short notice. We were grateful for assistance with travel exemption to Bulgaria due to UK having it listed on the green list, however Bulgaria put the UK on their red list.

We were down on the number of countries attending, however up on the number of participants. See statistics produced by Events Director. Big teams from the USA attended. Incredible event in terms of branding, production, Covid protocols (only 2 people reported having Covid who attended the event. A good result with over 500 in attendance).

European open – another amazing event, probably the best presented event in terms of the best production we have ever done, venue incredible with plenty of space for the



various functional areas. Moving forward, this is what we should be striving to achieve. Fantastic fights.

Kyrgyzstan – DW, AM and KB attended several meetings with the president of the federation. Our delegation attended an international event between Kyrgystan and Uzbekistan.

Andrew Mochanov (AM), held meetings with national coaches, KB & AM had a successful meeting with the president of the Republic. DW feels the IMMAF presence, although low key had an impact in terms of the presence of media especially engagement in TV interviews.

7. Presidents Opening remarks (KB)

EVENTS

KB echo thoughts of which DW expressed with regards to Bulgaria. We were supported by the Bulgaria federation amongst others in provisions for the event. There were still some staff who were unable to make the event, which is quite understandable given the current Covid regulations.

DW would like feedback from the board on the striking policy. Currently for young fighters no striking. Transitions was mentioned as an area to be considered. Discussion followed with issues such as re-training from one method to another; protest against judges decision but not the referee; training for coaches on the rules; viewing of video's which can cause more issues.

Congratulation to all staff who worked and performed exceptionally well with the addition of coping with Covid protocols.

World championships due to be held in November in Kazakhstan is postspond with a view to be held in 2022.

Asian Open scheduled for June 2022. Payments have been made for this, a further payment due August 2021 has not been paid. Further discussions to be held IK, KB, Mr Kuman the president of Kazakhstan federation regarding further payments. KB



waiting on the official letter from the Kazakhstan government or sports ministry to official sign off. KB will continue to pursue.

(WA) They have been pushing for deals in the UAE. The new federation has now been formed. The general secretary Mohammed Al Hosani was in Bulgaria where a discussion took place around a potential 3 year deal for the World Youth Championships which would commence in 2022.

The proposed deal would comprise of half a million dollars per year for hosting rights fee with them taking on all the expenses of hosting the event from 2022 to 2024.

Marc Goddard was in UAE doing a referee and judges course which went well. Jujitsu is being developed in Abu Dabai, plus looking into sponsorship. It's being pushed for Jujitsu to be a recognised sport within GASIF and IOC. Unfortunately not recognised during this round with regards to kick boxing.

Will go ahead once officially signed off.

World Teams Championships Bahrain

KB will report to board subject to the format of the championships due 3rd week in January 2022.

Senior Junior world championships 2021;

IMMAF cannot afford to put on a world championship without support of a host federation due to limited financial restraints. We need to balance out incoming funds. Various variants to take into consideration to World Championships being held such as the instability of COVID and other issues.

8. Governance Tracker Update (ND).

(2021 IMMAF STRATEGIC PLAN TRACKER - displayed on screen)

Oustanding from last meetings items from the old tracker are: -

- IMMAF staff handbook

We have developed a strategic plan tracker which is focused on the next couple of years. This system is based on regular contact with key departments. We can check



progress, impacts if any and how we can make changes to timing. It's to ensure the strategic plans stay on track.

The coding of the tracker is Green - completed; Red – high priority; Amber – on-going or low priority and a section in blue and grey for the board to update, adjustments can also be made. Formal meetings to be held every couple of months. The plans will be raised and discussed at board meetings.

Committees and Commissions update: -

a) General Governance

Declan Ritchie who is working with DW and ND, supporting the governance areas, has managed to secure Pro Bono legal experts who will support us with legal advise and in particular the panel for the arbitration and displinary commissions.

The Ethics commission have finished reviewing. They have requested the board to approve the setting up of a task force. They want to make sure all our policies and safeguarding are consistant. The objective is to deliver this updated code and policy matrix by the end of Q1 2022.

b) Transgender Policy

The first meeting will be held later in September. Looking at transitioning and scientific research.

We received an invitation to attend a 2 day event in Monaco on 8th October. It is organised by the Worlds Athletics. FIFA, IJF, UCI, IOC, World rugby, have also been invited. We are the only non GAISF sport to be invited. Good publicity opportunity for us.

c) Federations

The USA task force is continuing to focus on 2 objectives 1) making sure the US athletes compete for the USA at IMMAF events 2) to be available to help partners with any potential new federations in the USA. At present waiting for a report and preparing a business plan. We are confident we will be able to invite US athletes.



French Federations - we have a task force set up and are engaging well. FFB (French boxing federation) has sent us all the legal signed documentation which confirms their membership to IMMAF. A meeting is due to be held in September with the French minister of sport. Hoping that regulations will be laid down for the FFB. We will keep engagement via weekly meetings. 9. Finance report (JS). (Finance report 1ST June – to 31st August 2021 shared on-screen) Turnover: -Championships Fees – are now coming in, now the championships have started Sponsorship – there is a spike specific to membership income Cost of Sales - they are persistant month by month Gross profit – championship fees were higher in June b) Expenditure: -Exception expenditure include: Events – minimal, included some TV and broadcasting, championship consumables such as medals. Also advance payments for accommodation for the Youth Championship paid out. Foreign travel – showing as events have started. Spiked because of testing before travel. To be expected in the future.
